Applied Meta-Physics: Torah Meta-Physics- An Introduction to the Language of God

Understanding God's Blue- print – Ideas and Analogy

In Applied Meta-Physics, we recognize that God builds with **IDEAS**, and that analogy is **God's Language**.

The physical world is not separate from the Spiritual; rather, it is an expression—a reflection—of divine principles; that is, it rests in the bosom of the Spirit.

Understanding this allows us to read the world as a living text, where symbols and analogies reveal deep spiritual truths.

Another way of stating this, is that the Spiritual world is ‘overlayed’ or encapsulated, with the ‘material’ manifestation.

1.

The Language of Creation

Every object, process, and relationship in the world is a **symbol** communicating divine Wisdom. These symbols transcend spoken and written language; they are universal, operating through ideas, forms, and relationships. When we learn to see with Spiritual vision, we recognize that the cosmos speaks to us through analogy.

Some examples:

A Tree is a bridge between the unseen and the seen, with roots in the depths of the earth (hidden realms, foundation, Spirit) and branches reaching into the sky (growth, realization, and manifestation, universal Spirit) - a symbiotic relationship.

The Sun represents divine intelligence, light, and understanding, bringing life and illumination to all things.

The Moon symbolizes intellect, reflection, and receptive knowledge, much like the mind receives and reflects divine truth.

By contemplating these and many other symbols, we align ourselves with the deeper truths embedded, both in creation and in the sacred texts we have received.

2.

Divine Expression in Everyday Life

Just as God's Wisdom is woven into nature, so too is it expressed in our daily experiences. Life events, relationships, and personal struggles are part of a **living parable**, tailored to guide us toward clarity and alignment with divine order.

Illness and Healing: Disease (dis-ease) signals inner misalign-

ment—confusion, imbalance, or *suppressed* truth. Healing is not merely ‘physical’, rather it involves restoring Spiritual *clarity* to the mind, and heart. The only thing that *can heal* is **Spirit**.

Joy as a Sign of Health: True joy is not a fleeting emotion, rather it is the **thrill of life welling up from within**. It radiates outward, signifying a *Soul in harmony* with divine order.

Purity of Heart and Hidden Manna: Those who approach life with sincerity and openness to divine Wisdom receive the “hidden manna”—the Spiritual nourishment that sustains and enlightens them.

3.

Applying Meta-Physics: Living the Wisdom

As an example of the deeper import of these analogies: The commandment “Thou shalt not commit adultery”, is not merely about physical

relationships—it is a call to live purely from Divine Inspiration. The Higher Mind is to guide the Lower, ensuring that our thoughts, words, and actions remain untainted by distortion or confusion.

To apply meta-physics in daily life:

Slow down and observe the world as a living scripture, filled with divine symbols. Governed by Divine Law.

Seek the higher meaning in life's challenges, recognizing each as opportunities for transformation.

Build into manifestation the principles of the Divine Blueprint by aligning with the Divine Law, and by expressing Wisdom, Love, and Joy, without adulteration.

Learning to See and Speak the Divine Language.

God speaks in **images and ideas**, and these remain constant across all languages and cultures. To un-

derstand God's language of analogy, one must cultivate purity of heart and *clarity* of mind.

As we refine our perception, we begin to **see the previously unseen**, and in doing so, we become co-creators in divine expression.

This is the beginning of Applied Meta-Physics—**The oldest Science in existence; the study of ourselves and the world in which we find ourselves.** It is the practice of understanding and **applying Divine Wisdom** through the recognition of **analogy, symbolism, and universal truth** in every aspect of existence.

Let this be the foundation upon which we build the **New World** now emerging *through us*.

The following analogies are a few examples excerpted from “Discovering the Pentateuch”.

Applied Meta-Physics in the First Five Books of Moses:

The Blueprint for Human Evolution into the Image of God.

Statement of Purpose:

God said “Let us make man into our image, after our likeness”. The “**INTO** our image”, is God’s blueprint of our character. “**AFTER** our likeness”, is our participation in developing our character as we recognise God *within ourselves, and in the world.*

The Torah, the “Five books of Moses”, serves as the foundation **for human evolution** *into* the image and likeness of God. These scriptures are not merely historical records or religious doctrines; they are **meta-physical blueprints** designed to *guide humanity* in aligning with divine order.

God communicating through images and ideas, using **analogies** to convey Spiritual truths that speak directly to the *reasoning mind*—

truths that transcend language, time, and culture. When rightly understood, these revelations **illuminate** the path to Divine embodiment, **transforming the Soul into a living vessel of Wisdom, Love, and Joy.**

1. Genesis:

The Seed of Divine Order

Genesis lays the foundation by presenting creation as an act of divine **ideas** manifesting into reality. Each statement of creation presents an analogy for Spiritual development:

“Let there be light” (Gen 1:3) – The emergence of divine intelligence, the illumination of the higher mind - *also* the initial **spark generated when the sperm germinates the embryo.**

The Tree of Life and the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil – The choice between direct Divine connection (Tree of Life) and experiential learning through duality

(Tree of Knowledge).

Adam and Eve – The Divine breath (Spirit) animating form. Their fall represents the descent into identification with material existence, while their return to God is the path of *conscious restoration to Spiritual awareness*.

2. **Exodus: The Path of Liberation and Transformation**

Exodus symbolizes the journey from bondage (to ignorance and personal enslavement) to Divine alignment.

Pharaoh as the Lower Mind – The ‘hardened heart’ represents the lower mind’s resistance to Divine instruction; the personality clinging to selfishness, greed, fear and control, and consequently **hardened** in its ways.

Moses as the Higher Mind – The awakened inner voice leading the Soul (Israelites) out of bondage.

Our I AM in its alignment with Divine Law.

The Red Sea Parting – The moment of *faith* when the waters (subconscious barriers) are parted by trust in Divine guidance, and the essence of *Spirit is made real and tangible to one's mind and feelings*.

The Wilderness Journey – The purification process, shedding old mental constructs to prepare for **higher understanding**.

The Ten Commandments – Laws not merely for external morality, rather **first and foremost for internal Divine alignment**, establishing the proper function of the lower mind in service to the higher.

The commands are not merely moral prohibitions or societal rules; rather, they serve as **Spiritual instructions** for *inner alignment*. Each commandment restructures the **lower mind** (personality, habits, impulses, and

ad-diction) to serve the **Higher Self** (Spirit, Divine intelligence).

They are not imposed externally rather their Spirit arises from the **Law written on the heart**.

When understood *meta-physically*, they defragment, or *reorder consciousness*—leading to *inner* harmony, clarity of purpose, and unobstructed flow of Divine power.

In essence: The Commandments are tools for sanctifying thought, word, and deed—aligning the Soul with its true nature as an expression of “**I AM**”.

3.

Leviticus: Sacred Order and Purification

Leviticus details the principles of purification necessary for divine embodiment.

The Tabernacle as a Meta-physical Blueprint – The *outer court* (body), *the holy place*

(mind), and *the holy of holies* (Spiritual atonement) illustrate the process of sanctification-a forerunner of the 'three-in-one God-Self'.

Dietary Laws and Cleanliness – Not arbitrary rules rather guidelines reflecting the alignment of physical and energetic purity to maintain Spiritual clarity-each individual guided by **their own intuition according to their own understanding and progress.**

Atonement and Sacrifice – The surrender of the lower impulses to align with the Divine Will (God's Law).

4.

Numbers: The Process of Maturation

The Book of Numbers narrates the challenges of evolving human consciousness. The Israelites' wanderings mirror the Soul's journey toward *full Spiritual realization* (the promised land).

The Spies Sent to Canaan – The mind must assess the promised land (unified consciousness), yet fear (lower thoughts) often resists transformation.

Moses Striking the Rock instead of Speaking to the Rock – A lesson in obedience; Divine power must flow through us harmoniously, *not expressed via force*.

The Fiery Serpents – The *Kundalini* principle; those who look upon (raise it within themselves) the raised serpent (Spiritual awakening) are healed.

5.

Deuteronomy: The Covenant of Divine Union

Deuteronomy **reaffirms** the necessity of total commitment to divine Wisdom. **“Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is One”**. (Deut 6:4) – Recognition that **all things are unified in divine intelligence**.

Blessings and Curses – Manifestation follows alignment; those who walk in Divine order experience joy, while those who resist experience suffering. Suffering is not a punishment, it is designed to awaken us into a greater Spiritual awareness.

Moses' Departure – The higher guide leads the Soul to the **threshold of realization**, yet the journey into full embodiment must be undertaken by the individual (represented by Joshua leading into the promised land). We are each 'Joshua', meaning, we are each *fully accountable to, and responsible for our own lives.*

Summation

The Torah is a *meta-physical framework* guiding humanity from **unconscious existence through the ReGeneration into Divine likeness.**

God builds with IDEAS, and the Five books of Moses establish the foundational analogies necessary

for this transformation. Every law, event, and symbol serves as an encoded lesson for **our awakening to the Divine within**. By perceiving these Spiritual insights, the sincere and pure in heart partake of the “Hidden Manna”—the nourishment of the revealed Divine Wisdom, Love, and Joy. Through this process, humanity fulfils its highest calling: *to become living expressions of the Most High*.

Genesis 1–10: The Early Years (0–10 Years Old)

1. **Creation – The world is formed in six days.** *Analogy:* Birth and infancy — full of potential, yet unshaped and dependent.

2. **Eden & Humanity – Adam and Eve in paradise.** *Analogy:* Early childhood — innocence, harmony, and curiosity in a protected environment.

3. **The Fall – Disobedience and expulsion from Eden.** *Analogy:* First confrontation with consequence and responsibility (around age 3–5).

4. **Cain & Abel – Jealousy and the first act of violence.** *Analogy:* Sibling rivalry and early moral tension (age 6–7), learning the impact of emotional decisions.

5. **Genealogy of Adam – Lineages and long lifespans.** *Analogy:* Growing awareness of ancestry, time, and the passage of generations (age 8–9).

6. **Wickedness & the Nephilim – The earth becomes corrupt.** *Analogy:* First conscious recognition of injustice, evil, and the dark side of human nature (around age 10).

7. **The Flood – Noah's ark and the**

cleansing of the world. *Analogy:* A childhood crisis or symbolic death-and-rebirth moment, leading to inner reformation.

8. **The Waters Recede – Earth is revealed anew.** *Analogy:* Hope and renewal following turmoil — building on faith and understanding in communion with the Spirit.

9. **God's Covenant with Noah – The rainbow as a sign.** *Analogy:* Early moral structure and trust in a higher order — foundational ethical understanding.

Table of Nations – Human families spread across the earth. *Analogy:* Social expansion — entering community, forming new relationships, and developing identity among others.

Note:

Every chapter of each of the Five Books of Moses offers an *analogy* that reflects a stage of Spiritual evolution. As we mature, these metaphors shift from outer histori-

cal narratives to *inner transformative insights*—guiding us toward the full embodiment of the Divine *within*.

The *purpose* guided life:

When God ‘says’ “**Let there be light**” this is the **SPARK of the moment of conception**, where the Sperm germinates the Egg, and *also*, the First Light of Intelligence within Each of Us, as we build our body-temple.

That statement—“*Let there be Light*”—is far more than a poetic or veiled origin of the universe. It is a living pattern, a fractal moment repeated in all acts of Divine creation, especially **in the genesis of individual consciousness**.

It is also the *moment of conception*, when the sperm meets the egg **and the spark of life is ignited**—biologically, electrically, Spiritually. It is in mind, the *first flash of awareness*, the dawning of intelligence, within the growing embryo and ultimately within the Soul as it

awakens to its purpose.

“Let there be Light” is also the command of divine intelligence, spoken *within us*, at the genesis of our own being. It is the spark that ignites not only physical formation; also the shaping of the inner temple—the Soul’s development toward embodying Spirit.

“Let there be light” when we read and comprehend anything, or look at and comprehend anything, we are increasing our *light*.

Each human body is a temple under construction, and the ‘spark of Light’ (God) is the foundation stone. That Light is not external illumination—it is *intelligence*, awareness, self-recognition, and purpose unfolding. This is the *inner Christ* dawning on our minds.

God speaks, and *we become*.

Creation

The hermetic principle applies here:

*“As above
So below,
As within
So without”.*

Throughout each of the Five Books of Moses (and other sacred books) the literal stories serve as a *cloak* — a protective vessel for deeper truths.

The stories **engage the material mind** first, anchoring the narrative

in time and space. Yet unless a person is **Spiritually stirred**, their focus remains fixed on the surface, and they miss the *inner* blueprint.

Seeing more clearly requires either:

A **quickenings from within** — a moment of connecting directly to the intuitive Spiritual power and an awakening of the lower mind, which **impels** the seeker to re-read, re-think, and re-**see** the text, and dis-cover its Spiritual import.

Or:

A **community of elders or initiates** — those who live by the inner law, and know how to unlock it, guiding others, not with dogma rather with *lived wisdom*.

Without either, the reader may read and praise the words and traditions, yet **never consciously walk the path they conceal**.
